Branding and Acknowledgment Guidelines

June 2017

Introduction

This document outlines the correct use of the CCAFS name, colours and logo, as well as the correct way to acknowledge the program in research outputs. This guide should be used together with the CGIAR branding guidelines, which outlines the correct approach to using the CGIAR name and logo.

1. The correct name

English: The CGIAR Research Program on Climate Change, Agriculture and Food Security (CCAFS)



French: Programme de recherche du CGIAR sur le changement climatique, l'agriculture et la sécurité alimentaire (CCAFS)



Spanish: Programa de Investigación de CGIAR en Cambio Climático, Agricultura y Seguridad Alimentaria (CCAFS)



The CCAFS acronym is based on its English name. Avoid creating new acronyms based on translations.

2. The correct logo



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The correct CCAFS logo is a **composite logo** that includes the CGIAR logo:

Using the logo on Printed Material:

Minimum size: 50 x 15 mm

File types: use high-resolution files including TIF, .PDF, .AI or .EPS format.

Using the logo on screen:

Minimum size: 250 x 75 px

File types: use low-resolution files including JPG and PNG formats. They can be used with Microsoft and online

3. The correct colours

The CCAFS colours are a vital part of our brand identity and must be used on all CCAFS outputs, both online and printed. It is important to give the below Pantone® codes to printers you are working with, and to use the below RGB codes when working in Microsoft.



Using RGB Colours in Microsoft:

1. When you are picking the colour of a Font, a Fill or an Outline, please use the correct CCAFS colours, as above.
2. Select the More Colours option
3. Click on the Custom tab (see right)
4. Input the RGB codes as shown
5. The colour will then appear saved in your recent colours

6. Co-author acknowledgement

All publications issued by the CCAFS coordinating unit will acknowledge coauthors and the institutional affiliation of those co-authors.

Any CCAFS Flagship that benefits from EU/IFAD funding, must acknowledge CCAFS and EU/IFAD in all journal articles and publications issued by partners(e.g. FAO)



7. Acknowledgement CGIAR Centers

Joint Acknowledgment of CCAFS and CGIAR:

All centers that contributed to a particular initiative should be clearly acknowledged. The following is an example of how to jointly acknowledge CCAFS and members of CGIAR in communications and outreach (replace the underlined green text):

Example: This work was implemented as part of the International Center for Tropical Agriculture (CIAT) and the CGIAR Research Program on Climate Change, Agriculture and Food Security (CCAFS), which is carried out with support from CGIAR Fund Donors and through bilateral funding agreements. CGIAR is a name not an acronym: Since the reform, CGIAR is no longer a ‘consultative group’, and ‘CGIAR’ is no longer an acronym that stands for the ‘Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research’. Consequently, ‘CGIAR’ should never be spelled out or translated but promoted as a recognizable name in itself. CGIAR does not require the definitive article ‘the’ CGIAR

E-Newsletters	Global newsletters must have the Acknowledgment and Disclaimer text from section 4. Region/Flagship newsletters will have the same, plus an acknowledgment of the Flagship/Region's host institution, for example "The CCAFS East Africa Program is hosted by the International Livestock Research Institute (ILRI) in Nairobi, Kenya".
