Description of activity / study: This study was conducted by A4NH strategic partner, the Institute of Development Studies (IDS). This study was an independent evaluation of the Collective Action for Nutrition (CAN) Social Audit programme, which was designed and implemented by an Odisha-based NGO to reduce malnutrition among children and women by facilitating efficient implementation of food and nutrition programmes, ensuring transparency, downward accountability, and community participation. The evaluation assessed the short-term impacts of improving delivery of nutrition services and entitlements, as well as understand how the social audit lead to changes in knowledge and behavior at household and community levels.
