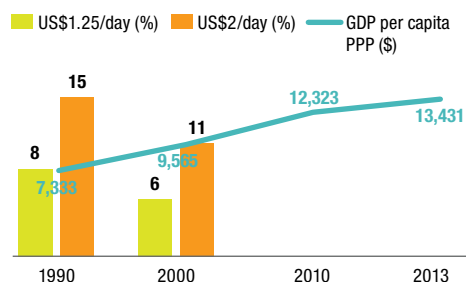


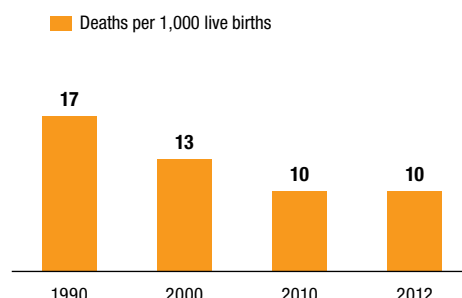

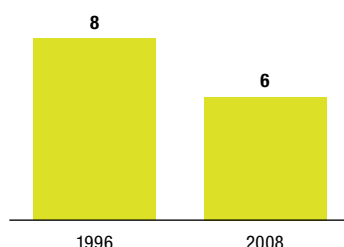

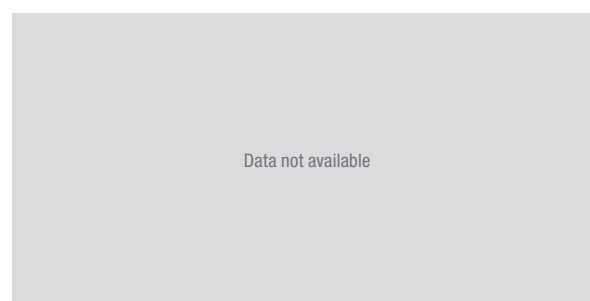

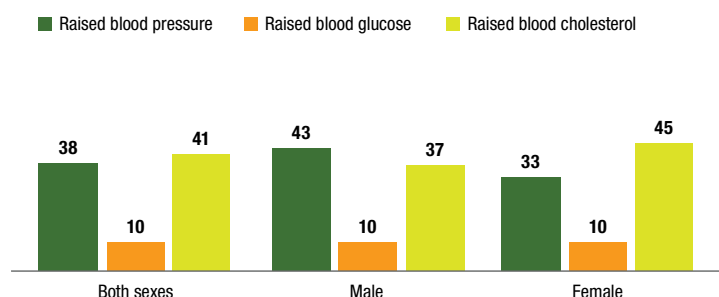

METABOLIC RISK FACTORS FOR DIET-RELATED NONCOMMUNICABLE DISEASES, 2008 (%)



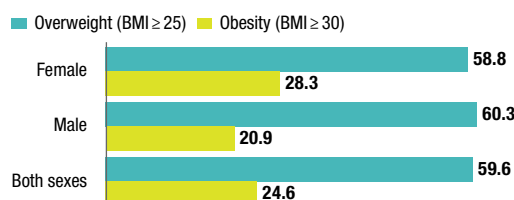

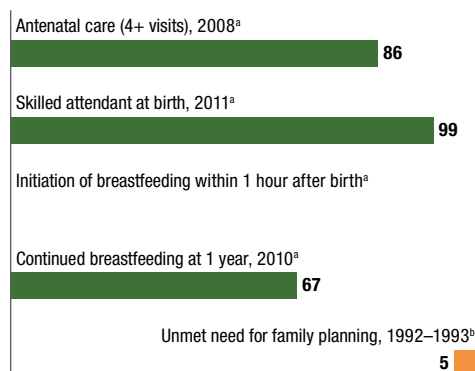

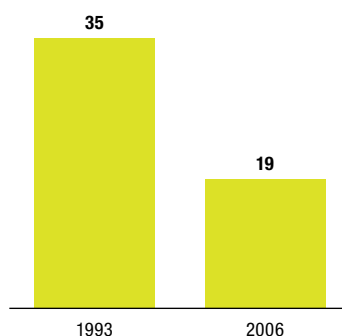

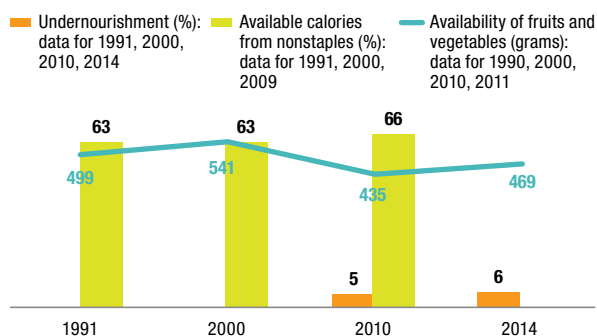

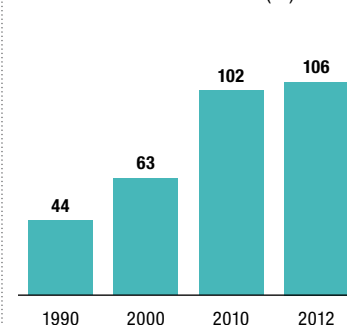

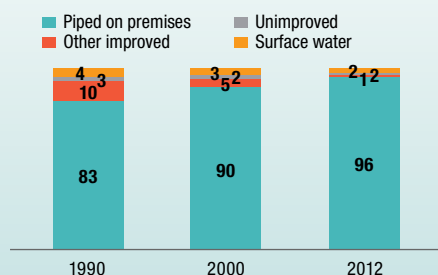

FEMALE SECONDARY EDUCATION ENROLLMENT (%)



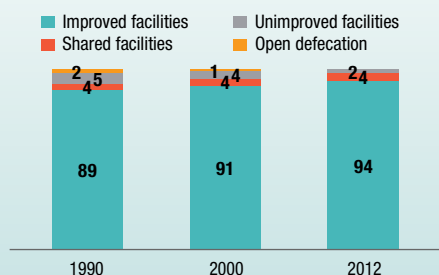

IMPROVED DRINKING WATER COVERAGE (%)



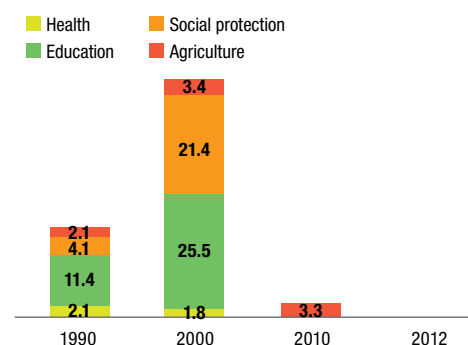
