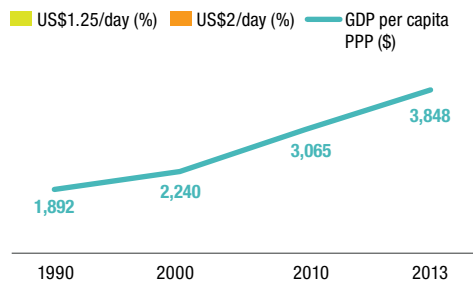


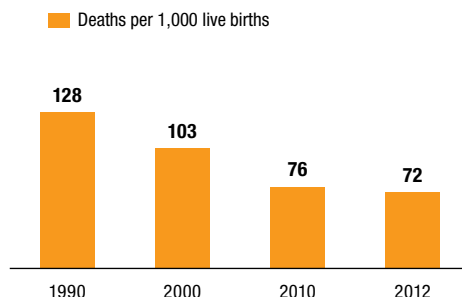

POVERTY RATES AND GDP



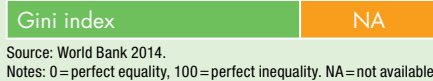

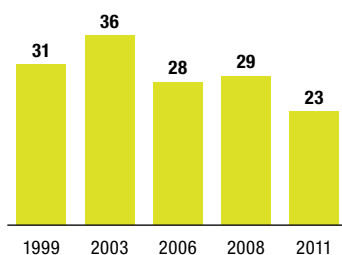

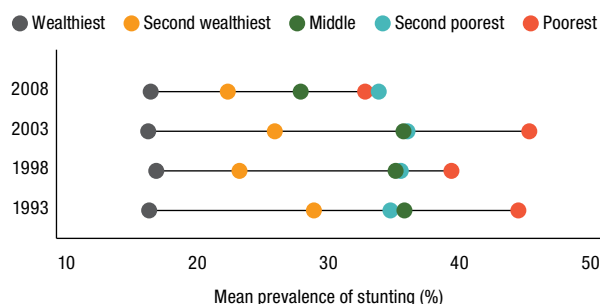

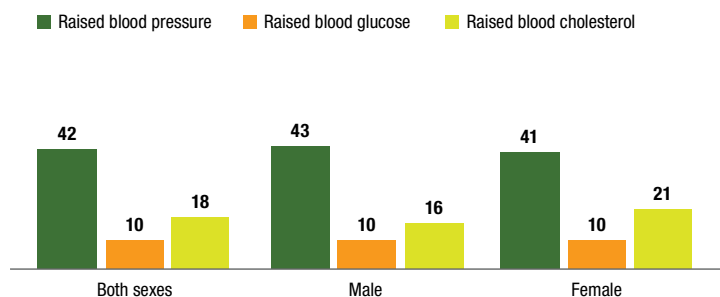

METABOLIC RISK FACTORS FOR DIET-RELATED NONCOMMUNICABLE DISEASES, 2008 (%)



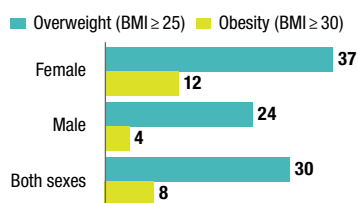

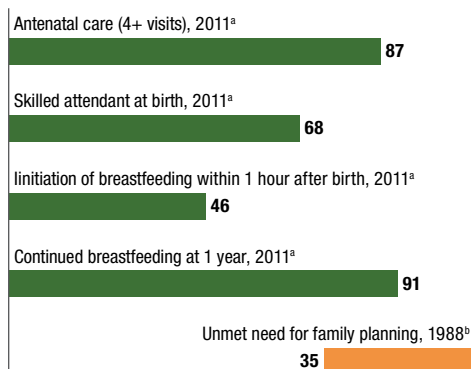

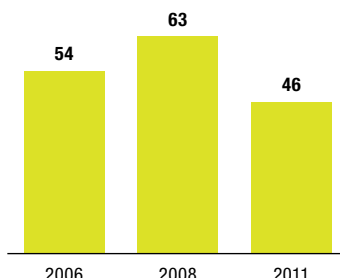
INTERVENTION COVERAGE AND CHILD-FEEDING PRACTICES

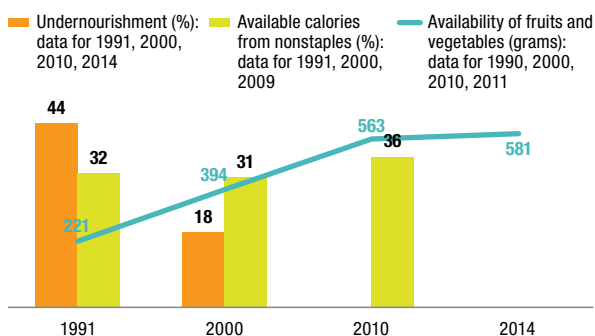

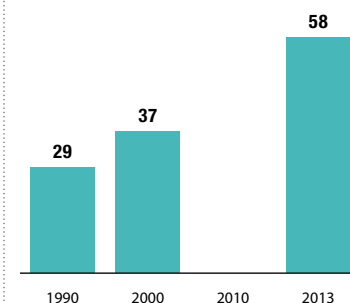

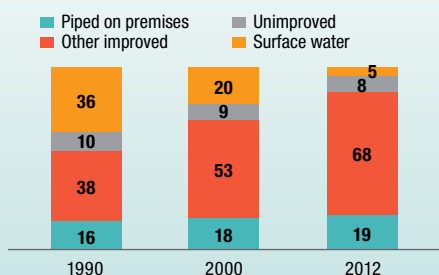

FEMALE SECONDARY EDUCATION ENROLLMENT (%)



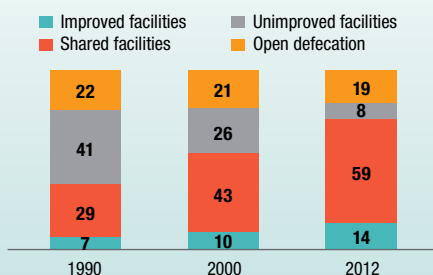

IMPROVED DRINKING WATER COVERAGE (%)



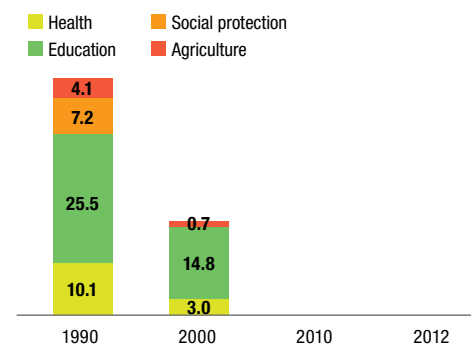
