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## Analysis of Successful Water Management Experiences in Andean Region Basins

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**Session: Basin (Andes) and Learning to Innovate**

### Key Message

This study shows that to achieve successful water management in the Andean region, certain conditions must be in place. These conditions are: participation of all involved actors; dialogue and agreement; transparency; access to adequate and timely information; having a basin approach; articulation of conservation and productive processes; capacity building and local leadership strengthening.

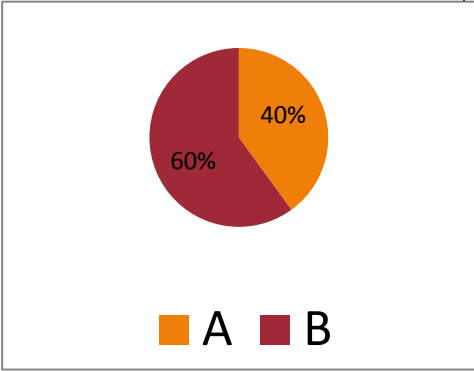
## Summary

Through expert consultation on topics regarding water management in the Andes region, we have identified successful water management experiences in different basins. We define a successful experience as one that has achieved concrete agreements and actions to face water management problems. We ranked and selected experiences and visited them to learn more about the main issues/problems, the actors, the approaches/strategies used, success factors and the changes achieved in the different actors. We made a cross-analysis between the different experiences with which we identified common strategies and success factors that permitted us to delineate the trends in water management within the Andes region.

We identified two trends. The first trend begins with the formation of an institutional platform and ends with the implementation of concrete actions in the field. The second begins with concrete field-

level actions and ends with the implementation of a management platform. Both trends have positive and negative aspects to them in terms of their efficiency and efficacy in the search for the objectives that were set to improve water management.
